Subject: **FIREARMS TAKEN FROM A RESIDENCE**

Burglary detectives need assistance identifying the suspect who entered a home at 235 S.W. 38<sup>th</sup> Court, under false pretenses and took several firearms, cash, and credit cards.

On January 31<sup>st</sup>, 2022 at approximately 1:55 p.m., the victim (Home Owner) was at work and his mother who suffers from dementia was home alone. The victim's mother was in the front porch when she was approached by the suspect who asked, in Spanish, if he could use the bathroom. She allowed the suspect to enter the residence thinking it was a family member. After the suspect used the bathroom, he went inside the victim's bedroom and took several items from the nightstand and three firearms. The suspect exited the residence a few minutes later through the front door and walked north bound on S.W. 38 Court to a white Ford utility work truck.

When the victim returned home, he noticed that three of his firearms were stolen. He also noticed several of his credit cards were also missing. He then reviewed surveillance footage which captured the suspect entering and exiting the residence.

Based on surveillance footage, the suspect arrived and left in an older model white Ford F-350 utility truck.

**Detectives need assistance in identifying the suspect and/or the vehicle used in the theft.**

**Suspect:** White Hispanic male, 40 to 50 years old, approximately 200 lbs, wearing aqua-colored facial covering, a white ball cap, a construction vest, and tan long shorts.

**Vehicle:** White F-350 utility work truck.
